## Our learning

This week we will learn more about Harvest to coincide with Harvest Festival. We will be learning around the story of The Little Red Hen. Our Harvest Festival service will be held in St Mary's Church on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October. We hope to see you all there.


This week the children will make their own bread. They will write a list of instructions explaining how to make bread. Later in the week, they will role play, sequence and retell the story of The Little Red Hen. They will develop number ordering skills and counting skills through counting out the hen's eggs. They can also build their fine motor skills this week by cutting and constructing a moving hen with split pins, and using tweezers to remove seeds from sunflowers. There will also be lots of food themed activities for the children to implement independently.


In phonics, the reception children who are new to phonics will learn the sounds s,a,t,p,i,n,m,d. We will continue to build our understanding of initial sounds, segmenting and blending skills, and writing skills. The reception children who are secure with these sounds will recap ai, ee, igh and oa

The nursery children will continue to take part in a short singing or story session during phonics time.
